"Fearless Love"



Last fall, our Stewardship theme focused on "Fearless Generosity." We looked at fearless giving, sowing, reaping and living. The common thread weaving them all together was "fearless."

The idea of living fearlessly appears throughout both the Old and New Testament. It is a challenge constantly being set forth by Jesus. As we explored it last fall, I think we began to understand its importance in our lives. If we are constantly living in fear of one thing or another, we're probably not living with much faith.

Over and over again, Jesus said, "Fear not." He knew that fear was a huge stumbling block to faith and a huge stumbling block to service. We try to live in the safety and security of what is fully known and avoid risking anything that might threaten that security. Jesus suggests that living like that isn't really living – certainly not as God intended us to live. We must sometimes step out of the tried and true in life and attempt something new, daring and challenging.

We find a prime example of that – in fact, three prime examples of that – in the beautiful little Old Testament book of Ruth.

As we celebrate Valentines' Day next Tuesday, I think Ruth has some wonderful lessons to teach us. I urge you to read the entire book (it's only 4 chapters) and pay particular attention to Ruth 2:1-16 for marvelous examples of "Fearless Love."

To the Session of Eastminster Presbyterian Church:

As we are told by Koheleth, the writer of Ecclesiastes, "There is a time and season for everything under the sun."

Knowing this to be true, I am meeting with you today to inform you I am resigning from my calling as the Director of Christian Education effective February 28, 2017.

Dennis and I had not yet met when we received our calls to ministry. We have always believed our calls to be separate even while we were serving the same church families. Dennis and I are in agreement that my call to Eastminster has come to an end while his call to Eastminster continues.

It has truly been my privilege to direct the educational programs at Eastminster. Our church family has a deep commitment to Christian Education. Our educational programs are strong. They are running smoothly and every program is solidly staffed.

At a time when adult Sunday School is facing extinction, our adult Sunday School program is as fine and diverse a program as one will find anywhere. We have excellent and dedicated leadership.

It has been a blessing to have had the privilege of nurturing two sets of children, pre-school through high school, as they have gone through our educational program. I have tried to provide for these children the same Christian education that I provided for my own children.

Our church children have grown and followed God into areas of Christian service. We have seen them take their faith into the workplace. Many of them continue to be involved in church families. They are raising their children in our faith. I have seen them volunteer their time and reach into their billfolds to help a hurting world in the name of Christ. It has been such an honor to play even the tiniest role in this happening.

Now Annie Engelbrecht is ready to graduate. She and so many others among our church children and youth are already stepping forward in areas of leadership. Others are waiting in the wings for the opportunity to do so. Our children know their Bible and have been given the opportunity to have a strong and firm foundation in faith. They are blessed with fantastic Sunday School teachers to guide them. The children understand what it means to serve God. My deepest prayer is that the roots of faith we have planted in them will stay strong and serve our children well all the days of their lives.

A new generation now awaits nurturing. Our two-three years old class is brimming with excitement every Sunday. This is both very fulfilling and very challenging.

I believe it is time for the church to look ahead to see if they want to continue the programs that are now in place or determine if these programs need to be modified or uprooted to make room for new methods and programs in our changing and fast-paced world. We must move our programs forward in the most meaningful and energetic ways

I do not believe that I am the person to do this. Although the CE Committee already has laid out tentative plans for every age group through the end of the summer, I will not be directing these programs should they be carried out.

Now it is time to see what new doors God may be opening for our church family and for me personally. To allay any concerns, my health and home life are fine. I am not retiring. I am resigning. I deeply believe my calling is a life-long call to serve God. I am willing to and have been dedicated to walk through any new doors God has chosen to open before me.

Eastminster is my church family and will remain my church family. After a necessary period of separation for adjustment for both the church and for me, I will continue to worship at Eastminster unless I should receive a new calling that precludes me from being in worship. Should that happen, I will resume the same relationship I had with Eastminster when I previously had another calling.

My heart is full of gratitude for having been given the opportunity to have served as the Director of Christian Education for Eastminster Presbyterian Church. I do not submit my resignation lightly but with a true sense of love and peace.
