### "Haughty Eyes"

In last Wednesday's Assembly Night devotion, I began by saying something I've said on many occasions – "I have the

greatest job in the world." Among the many reasons for saying that is something I'm experiencing this summer.

Our Summer Sermon Series (that I find much easier to type than to say without stumbling) is focusing on Books, Movies & Music. I'm the one who will be doing the selection of which four books, four movies and four songs we'll use to guide us in a study of scripture and faith. The fact that I am the one who will be choosing the books, movies and songs is a tremendous privilege. Wouldn't you like to have the opportunity to decide which four books, movies and songs should be shared with a large number of people? I invite you to share with me any that you would suggest be used and while I have a preliminary idea of what we'll be using, I'm open to making changes.

This series connects with our Christianity & the Arts program because one of the foundational components of that emphasis is the conviction that something in the world of the Arts doesn't have to be overtly Christian to carry a Christian message. That will be true with a number of the books, movies and songs on which we will focus this summer.

This week, I'd like to focus on a book that has only recently come to my attention and enthralled me with its concept and the message it conveyes. I will admit that it made me extremely uncomfortable and filled me with a sense of remorse and guilt. That's probably not the best way to endorse a book, but I'll add that I also found it tremendously encouraging and challenging.

Read Isaiah 58:1-12 this week as we learn some valuable lessons from <u>Under the Overpass</u> while also learning what it means to have "Haughty Eyes."


Eastminster's own Allen Sanderson has played an integral part in the Museum coming to fruition. If you would like to experience this memorable time in history, be sure to visit on the following days:
