

“MARCH IN MARK”

“The Consummate Commandment”



We say it every year and since I said it this past Sunday, you can repeat it along with me – “*We move so quickly from the ‘Hosannas’ of Palm Sunday to the ‘He is risens’ of Easter that we give no thought to what lies between the two.*”

As we also said Sunday, we’re going to try to correct that this year during Lent by focusing on the events that took place during Holy Week. The logical guide will be the gospel of Mark because he seems to actually give us daily divisions of what took place in the life of Jesus between Palm Sunday and Good Friday.


Last week, we looked at the event that we commonly refer to as “the cleansing of the temple.” Mark tells us that took place on Monday of Holy Week. Interestingly, in the gospel of John, we find that event much earlier in the ministry of Jesus.

This Sunday, we’ll look at a passage that also reads differently in Mark than it does in the other gospels. In Matthew and in Luke, we find a religious leader giving us one of the most important directives of the New Testament in response to a question that Jesus asked – in response to a question asked of *him*.

In Mark’s gospel, though, it is Jesus himself who gives us that important directive. It’s also one of the few times that we find an encounter that Jesus had with a religious leader being one of seeming cordiality and agreement.

Read Mark 12:28-34 as we continue our MARCH IN MARK with “The Consummate Commandment.”
