### "Flawed Perfection"

Have you ever wondered what the perfect community would look like? Obviously, there is no such thing but if you could take **PASTOR** all the various ratings that are offered by innumerable sources and put them together

in one community, what would it look like?

You've got the best city for young adults, the best city for raising children, the best city for health care, the best city for recreational activities, the best city for sporting events and the best city for education. There's even a best city for antique collectors!

So what if you put them all together in one place to create a utopian community? We all know that's impossible and, of course, you'd end up with some contradictory "best places for" categories. For example, you've got a "best place for liberals" and a "best place for conservatives." Hmm. How's that going to work?

As we look at the book of Acts, we find a series of stories about the early Church. There are stories of the Church in dozens of cities throughout the land of Israel and beyond. There is one place, though, where we're told what the church was like in the very beginning.

At the end of Peter's sermon on the day of Pentecost, we're given a description of what the earliest church in Jerusalem was like – how it operated and how it touched lives. We read the description of that church and we have a longing to be part of that kind of community. There's probably more, though, that needs to be explored as we look closely at that first church.

Read Acts 2:42-47, where Luke gives us a description of what we might call "Flawed Perfection."

## Our Kids & Youth in Action!



May 13 is our Saturday help at Sister Joanna's table. Please consider joining us in providing lunch for people in our community. We will have a sign up sheet


in Fellowship Hall, or just let the church know you can help out. You will never feel as good as you do when helping someone else.
