

To all of my Eastminster family,








Summer Children's Worship

For many years, we at Eastminster have been strong supporters of the Birthday Offering of Presbyterian Women. This is an offering that, for nearly 90 years, has provided hope and security to vulnerable people around the world. Each year, grant requests are submitted and the recipients of those grants are doing tremendous things in the name of Christ all around the world.

After reviewing numerous proposals, the Creative Ministries Offering Committee chose three recipients:

NAVAJO WATER PROJECT NEW MEXICO - The Navajo Water project will eventually provide water systems to 205 families at the Smith Lake Navajo Reservation in New Mexico. This Birthday Offering grant will provide a running water system for 40 families that do not have access to running water in their homes.

THE FAMILY JUSTICE CENTER - The Family Justice Center (FJC) Safe Haven for Victims of Domestic Violence currently operates an emergency shelter for victims of domestic violence in Georgetown and Horry Counties in South Carolina. With room for only 11 people, the shelter is frequently at capacity. The Presbyterian Women Birthday Offering grant will assist FJC in achieving its goal of constructing a new domestic violence shelter for victims of abuse living in these two counties of northeastern South Carolina.

FIRST HAND AID CUBA - First Hand Aid Rural Clinic Development Initiative exists to diminish the suffering of the most marginalized Cuban citizens by providing them hope, dignity, and the basic necessities of life and health. The Rural Clinic Development Initiative is designed to establish six medical clinics in partnership with, and located at, Presbyterian Churches in rural Cuba that will provide medicine and care not available, or difficult to get, from Cuban sources in those communities. In rural Cuba, where people often do not have a means to get to, or the opportunity to benefit from, the resources located in large urban centers like Havana, people turn to the church for their basic needs— including certain medical needs. This project will build, fund, stock, and staff six medical clinics ("Program Clinics") housed in long-existing and established Presbyterian Churches located in rural Cuba where needs are great and supply is limited.

The projects of the Presbyterian Women Birthday Offering are very carefully chosen and we have the assurance that the ministry being provided is of the highest integrity and truly meeting needs that will change lives. On Sunday, June 11, we will receive the Birthday Offering in Worship. We encourage you to participate in this very meaningful opportunity to share the love of Jesus Christ with those in need.
