Matthew 3:13-17 January 8, '17

"WHY ME?"

"WHY ME?"

IT'S A QUESTION WE HAVE ALL ASKED AT ONE TIME OR ANOTHER, ISN'T IT?

IF YOU HAVEN'T, YOU'VE EITHER BEEN VERY FORTUNATE OR, PERHAPS, NOT VERY HONEST.

FOR MOST OF US, IF WE HAVEN'T ACTUALLY
ASKED IT, WE'VE AT LEAST *THOUGHT* OF ASKING IT,
HAVEN'T WE?

AND WHEN WE SEE A SERMON WITH THAT
TITLE, WE DRAW A CONCLUSION ABOUT THE
DIRECTION THAT SERMON WILL TAKE.

WE MAY EVEN HAVE AN EXPECTATION OF THE ACTUAL PASSAGE ON WHICH THAT SERMON WILL BE BASED.

AND IF WE CAN'T NARROW IT DOWN TO A
SPECIFIC PASSAGE, WE'LL AT LEAST HAVE A
PRETTY GOOD IDEA OF A BIBLICAL PERSON ON
WHOM THE SERMON WILL FOCUS.

IT'S GOTTA BE JOB, RIGHT?

BE THE APOSTLE PAUL.

YOU COULD ALMOST OPEN YOUR BIBLE TO THE BOOK OF JOB AND RANDOMLY POINT YOUR FINGER ON THE PAGE & FIND VERSES THAT WOULD BE APPROPRIATE FOR A SERMON ENTITLED "WHY ME?" ANOTHER GOOD CANDIDATE, THOUGH, WOULD

BY HIS OWN ACCOUNT, PAUL ENDURED MORE
TRIALS & TRIBULATIONS THAN MOST ANY OF US
WILL EVER BE ASKED TO ENDURE.

SURELY, HE COULD LOGICALLY & REASONABLY HAVE ASKED, "WHY ME?"

SO THERE'S JOB AS AN OLD TESTAMENT MODEL
& PAUL AS A NEW TESTAMENT MODEL OF
INDIVIDUALS WHO COULD SERVE AS THE BASIS OF A
SERMON ADDRESSING THE QUESTION "WHY ME?"
BUT THE PASSAGE WE'VE READ THIS MORNING?
IT DOESN'T SEEM TO FIT AT ALL, DOES IT?
THIS IS THE DAY WE CALL "BAPTISM OF THE
LORD SUNDAY" AND WE'VE READ MATTHEW'S
ACCOUNT OF THAT EVENT.

IT DOESN'T SEEM AT ALL TO BE CONNECTED TO
THE OFT-ASKED QUESTION "WHY ME?" - AT LEAST
NOT IN THE TRADITIONAL SENSE IN WHICH THE
QUESTION IS ASKED.

WHEN WE THINK OF THAT QUESTION, WE THINK OF IT BEING ASKED IN A NEGATIVE FASHION.

WE TAKE THE TITLE OF THE HAROLD KUSHNER

CLASSIC - WHY DO BAD THINGS HAPPEN TO GOOD

PEOPLE? – AND MAKE IT PERSONAL – "WHY DO BAD

THINGS HAPPEN TO ME?"

THERE IS AN IMPLIED "BECAUSE I DON'T

DESERVE IT" THAT WE TACK ON TO THE QUESTION.

IN OTHER WORDS, WHAT WE'RE REALLY

ASKING IS, "WHY DO BAD THINGS HAPPEN TO ME,
BECAUSE I DON'T DESERVE IT."

WE COME BACK, THOUGH, TO THIS PASSAGE
WE'VE JUST READ & IT DOESN'T SEEM TO FIT WITH
THE QUESTION.

WHAT DOES THE BAPTISM OF JESUS HAVE TO DO WITH THE QUESTION "WHY ME?"

WHAT COULD POSSIBLY BE SO BAD ABOUT

BAPTISM – EITHER FOR JOHN – THE ONE DOING THE

BAPTIZING, OR FOR JESUS – THE *BAPTIZEE* – THAT
WOULD CAUSE EITHER ONE OF THEM TO ASK, "WHY
ME?"

IT *DOES* MAKE SENSE – BUT ONLY IF WE CHANGE OUR FOCUS.

WHAT IS REQUIRED IS NOT A SLIGHT CHANGE
OF FOCUS BUT, RATHER, A COMPLETE REVERSAL OF
THE WAY WE TRADITIONALLY VIEW THAT
QUESTION.

ORDINARILY, WHEN WE THINK OF THIS STORY
OF THE BAPTISM OF JESUS, WE THINK OF THE
EVENT ITSELF & ALL OF THE MIRACULOUS
ELEMENTS IT CONTAINS – THE HEAVENS BEING
RIPPED OPEN, THE DESCENT OF THE DOVE & THE
VOICE OF GOD PROCLAIMING, "THIS IS MY BELOVED
SON, WITH WHOM I AM WELL-PLEASED."

IMAGINE BEING IN THE CROWD THAT DAY & HEARING THAT VOICE.

HOW DOES IT SOUND?

TO HELP PREPARE YOU FOR THE REVERSAL OF
THE WAY WE UNDERSTAND THE "WHY ME?"
QUESTION, LET ME SUGGEST A DIFFERENT WAY OF
UNDERSTANDING THAT HEAVENLY VOICE.

TRY TO IMAGINE THE SOUND OF THAT VOICE
BEING BOTH STRONG & GENTLE - POWERFUL, YET
MELODIC.

TRY TO HEAR IT AS THE SOUND OF A LOVING &
ADORING YOUNG MOTHER, INTRODUCING HER
NEWBORN SON FOR THE FIRST TIME TO EAGERLY
AWAITING FRIENDS & FAMILY MEMBERS - "THIS IS
MY BELOVED SON WITH WHOM I AM WELL-PLEASED."

THAT'S NOT THE WAY WE TRADITIONALLY

THINK OF THAT DIVINE VOICE FROM HEAVEN, IS IT?

SO, TOO, WITH THAT QUESTION, "WHY ME?"

IT'S CONNECTION TO THIS PASSAGE IS NOT IN THE ACTION-PACKED, MIRACLE-FILLED SECOND HALF OF THE STORY, BUT RATHER IN THE BRIEF, MUNDANE & SEEMINGLY INNOCUOUS DIALOGUE BETWEEN JESUS & JOHN.

THIS BAPTISMAL STORY IS FOUND IN ALL FOUR GOSPELS BUT, INTERESTINGLY, THIS EXCHANGE BETWEEN JESUS & JOHN IS ONLY FOUND IN MATTHEW.

AND HERE'S WHERE THE "WHY ME?" QUESTION ENTERS.

ISN'T JOHN, IN ESSENCE, ASKING "WHY ME? WHY

AM I THE ONE WHO WILL BAPTIZE THE MESSIAH?

WHY HAVE I BEEN GIVEN THIS INCREDIBLE HONOR & PRIVILEGE?"

IT'S REALLY VERY MUCH THE OPPOSITE OF OUR TRADITIONAL UNDERSTANDING, ISN'T IT?

WE THINK OF "WHY ME?" AS IN, "WHY HAVE I
BEEN SO CURSED?"

JOHN IS ASKING THE QUESTION AS IN "WHY HAVE I BEEN SO BLESSED?"

WE THINK OF "WHY ME? WHAT HAVE I DONE TO DESERVE THIS?" IN A NEGATIVE CONTEXT.

JOHN ASKS "WHY ME? WHAT HAVE I DONE TO

DESERVE THIS?" IN THE MOST POSITIVE FASHION

IMAGINABLE.

AND ISN'T THAT, PERHAPS, A BETTER WAY TO LOOK AT LIFE & A BETTER WAY TO CONSIDER THAT QUESTION?

I THINK THIS FITS, NOT ONLY THIS PASSAGE
ABOUT THE BAPTISM OF JESUS BUT I THINK IT ALSO
FITS WITH THIS DAY OF ORDINATION &
INSTALLATION OF OFFICERS.

FIRST, LET ME OFFER PERSONAL

OBSERVATIONS OF THE FITTING NATURE OF THIS

PASSAGE & THIS QUESTION.

I'VE RECENTLY TALKED ABOUT THE
TREMENDOUS PRIVILEGE I FEEL IT IS TO
EXPERIENCE VARIOUS ASPECTS OF MINISTRY –
THINGS LIKE SERVING COMMUNION, OFFICIATING
AT WEDDINGS OR READING LUKE'S CHRISTMAS
STORY ON CHRISTMAS EVE.

I WOULD ADD TO THAT LIST THE ORDINATION OF CHURCH OFFICERS.

FROM THE FIRST TIME I EVER DID IT, I NEVER
CEASE TO BE OVERWHELMED BY IT.

IT IS ONE OF THOSE EXPERIENCES THAT
PROFOUNDLY LEAVES ME WITH A "WHY ME? WHAT
HAVE I DONE TO DESERVE THIS?" FEELING.

IT'S VERY SIMILAR TO WHAT JOHN WAS
FEELING AS HE WAS GIVEN THE TREMENDOUS
HONOR & PRIVILEGE OF BAPTIZING JESUS.

GRANTED, THERE ARE NO MESSIAHS BEING
ORDAINED THIS MORNING & YET THERE ARE
INDIVIDUALS FAR MORE GIFTED & IMMENSELY
MORE SPIRITUALLY DEVOTED THAN ME – AND <u>I'M</u>
ORDAINING <u>THEM!</u>

THAT'S MY PERSONAL OBSERVATION OF THE CONNECTION BETWEEN THE "WHY ME?" QUESTION,

THE ORDINATION OF OFFICERS & THE BAPTISM OF JESUS.

I'M SURE MOST OF OUR NEWLY-ORDAINED

OFFICERS HAVE MUCH THE SAME FEELING – AND, IF

NOT, THEY SHOULD!

YOU'RE THINKING – "WHY ME? WHAT HAVE I

DONE TO DESERVE THIS?!"

YOU'RE WONDERING WHY GOD HAS CALLED YOU INTO SERVICE?

WHY HAS GOD CHOSEN YOU AS A LEADER IN THE LIFE OF CHRIST'S CHURCH?

LET'S GO BACK TO THE TRADITIONAL WAY WE UNDERSTAND THE "WHY ME?" QUESTION.

IT HAS OFTEN BEEN SUGGESTED THAT THERE ARE BETTER WAYS TO UNDERSTAND IT WHEN IT'S USED IN THE CUSTOMARY NEGATIVE WAY.

INSTEAD OF ASKING "WHY ME?," PERHAPS WE SHOULD ASK "WHY NOT ME?"

MANY OF YOU RECALL DAVID BAILEY SAYING
THAT WHEN HE ASKED THE "WHY ME?" QUESTION
OF GOD FOLLOWING HIS BRAIN TUMOR DIAGNOSIS,
HE HEARD GOD TELL HIM THAT THE QUESTION HE
SHOULD REALLY BE ASKING WAS "WHAT NOW?"

MAYBE BOTH OF THOSE ARE ALSO BETTER

QUESTIONS TO BE ASKING WHEN WE REVERSE OUR

UNDERSTANDING.

WHEN WE'RE ASKING "WHY ME? WHY HAVE I

BEEN SO BLESSED? WHAT HAVE I DONE TO DESERVE

THIS?" – PERHAPS WE SHOULD FOLLOW THOSE

QUESTIONS WITH "WHY NOT ME?" & "WHAT NOW?"

BECAUSE, YOU SEE, I THINK THIS TAKES US

BACK TO THIS PASSAGE & BACK TO THE BAPTISM

OF JESUS & THE REASON FOR THAT BAPTISM.

WE'RE CONFUSED BY IT & MATTHEW – AND ONLY MATTHEW AMONG THE GOSPEL WRITERS – REALLY OPENLY SHARES OUR CONFUSION WHEN HE ADDS THIS BRIEF BIT OF DIALOGUE BETWEEN JESUS AND JOHN.

WHEN HE HAS JOHN SAYING "I NEED TO BE

BAPTIZED BY YOU, AND DO YOU COME TO ME?!" –

MATTHEW IS REALLY SHARING HIS OWN

CONFUSION ABOUT THE MATTER!

AND THE RESPONSE OF JESUS – "LET IT BE SO

NOW, FOR IT IS PROPER FOR US IN THIS WAY TO

FULFILL ALL RIGHTEOUSNESS" – ARE THE VERY

FIRST WORDS THAT JESUS SPEAKS IN MATTHEW'S GOSPEL!

WE THINK OF BAPTISM AS SIMPLY BEING A
CLEANSING FROM SIN & THAT'S WHY WE CAN'T
UNDERSTAND WHY JESUS HAD TO BE BAPTIZED.

I THINK BAPTISM IS ALSO A WAY IN WHICH JESUS IDENTIFIES WITH OUR HUMANITY.

EVEN THOUGH JESUS WAS SINLESS, HIS BAPTISM
IS A WAY OF ENTERING INTO OUR WORLD &
IDENTIFYING WITH EVERY ONE OF US.

THE IMPLICATIONS OF THIS ARE ENORMOUS – STARTING WITH THAT SAME QUESTION.

"WHY ME?"

WHETHER IT'S ME AS A MINISTER OF WORD &
SACRAMENT BEING ASTOUNDED THAT I HAVE BEEN
CALLED UPON TO EXPERIENCE SOME OF THE

GREATEST MOMENTS OF LIFE IMAGINABLE OR
WHETHER IT'S SOMEONE BEING ORDAINED INTO A
CHURCH OFFICE WITH DUTIES & RESPONSIBILITIES
OR WHETHER IT'S EVERY ONE OF US AS PART OF
THE BODY OF CHRIST CALLED UPON TO SERVE
THOSE AROUND US, WE DON'T DO IT ALONE.

ONE OF THE MOST IMPORTANT MOMENTS OF
MY LIFE HAPPENED WHEN I WAS SERVING AS A
STUDENT HOSPITAL CHAPLAIN WHILE I WAS IN
SEMINARY.

IT WAS INCREDIBLY AWKWARD &
UNCOMFORTABLE TO WALK INTO A ROOM AND
TALK TO A PATIENT & THEN PRAY WITH THEM.

I SHARED MY DISCOMFORT WITH MY
SUPERVISOR & TOLD HIM I JUST DIDN'T FEEL
QUALIFIED TO DO THAT.

I REMEMBER HIM LOOKING AT ME & SAYING
"THE REASON YOU DON'T FEEL QUALIFIED IS
BECAUSE YOU'RE NOT!

AND YOU NEVER WILL BE.

BUT WHO SAID ANYTHING ABOUT BEING
QUALIFIED?

WHAT YOU TRY TO PASS OFF AS HUMILITY IS, IN REALITY, THE EPITOME OF ARROGANCE!

YOU THINK YOU HAVE TO HAVE SOME SPECIAL

ABILITY OR GIFT - AS IF YOU'RE THE ONE DOING

SOMETHING.

IT'S NOT ABOUT YOU – IT'S ABOUT WHO YOU REPRESENT.

YOU ARE LITTLE MORE THAN A CHANNEL FOR
GOD'S PRESENCE & GOD'S GRACE IN ANOTHER
PERSON'S LIFE.

YOU GO AS A REPRESENTATIVE OF JESUS CHRIST."

THAT WAS AN "AH-HA" MOMENT FOR ME THAT

I'VE NEVER FORGOTTEN.

THAT'S TRUE FOR ALL OF US, ISN'T IT?

REGARDLESS OF THE FORM IT TAKES, EVERY

SINGLE ONE OF US IS CALLED BY GOD TO SERVE IN

SOME FORM OR FASHION.

TO GO BACK TO A THEME WE'VE BEEN USING FOR MONTHS NOW, WHEN GOD PRESENTS AN OPEN DOOR OF SERVICE TO YOU, AND YOU'RE INCLINED TO ASK "WHY ME? WHY HAVE I BEEN SO BLESSED? WHAT HAVE I DONE TO DESERVE THIS?" – REMEMBER, YOU DON'T GO ALONE.

YOU ARE LITTLE MORE THAN A CHANNEL BEING USED BY CHRIST HIMSELF TO SHOW HIS LOVE.

HE'S THERE AT YOUR SIDE & YOUR WORK IS HIS

WORK. AMEN.
