Last Sunday, Barb Ferguson continued our summer series by helping us see Rembrandt’s “Return of the Prodigal” - the painting that hangs in The Gallery at the entrance to our narthex and sanctuary – in a brand-new way. Her

sermon also helped us in understanding the parable of Jesus in a new way as well as she focused on the book of Henri Nouwen that is based on both the painting and the parable.

This Sunday, we’ll continue the film portion of the series with the conclusion and presentation of our Vacation Bible School program. For more than 20 years, it has become a tradition at Eastminster to have the sermon for this day focus on a children’s story or movie and direct it more to the children than the adults. As we know, though, a lesson for children always touches a need that we have as adults as well.

One of the finest examples of this is the book by Robert Fulghum – All I Really Need to Know I Learned in Kindergarten. Lessons that we learn very early in life are lessons that stay with us and have the greatest meaning. That being the case, there are very valuable lessons that are conveyed in many children’s stories and movies.

This week, our VBS program is centered on a camp theme and it seems fitting that our sermon for VBS presentation Sunday should also have a very outdoor focus. An outstanding children’s animated movie that was just released last November is a perfect fit for our VBS theme.

Read Matthew 14:22-33 as we learn valuable lessons for children (and adults) from “The Gospel According to Moana.”

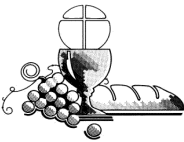

We went to see the monuments in Washington. I saw the Lincoln, Vietnam, and the Korean monuments.

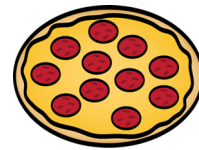
