"The Big Picture"

"Life is difficult."

That's the opening line of a classic book PASTOR written by M. Scott Peck. It's a line that is often included in lists of well-known

opening lines of books. It's a simple line and one that isn't really terribly profound. We all know that to be true.

What makes the line memorable is simply the fact that it's the very first line of Peck's book The Road Less Traveled. Just two paragraphs later, he emphasizes his point by saying "Life is a series of problems." We all know that to be true as well. Some of us seemingly have more than others, but there's no denying the fact that life is a series of prob-

I think of all this as I read the story of Joseph in the Old Testament. If anyone had problems, it was Joseph! He had enough problems for nearly all of us! Somehow, though, things seemed to work out well for Joseph. He managed to get through his difficulties and emerge from them as a better person – perhaps even because of his difficulties.

Perhaps it's that last part that is most important. Without his difficulties and problems, things would have been quite different, not only for Joseph, but for his family and even the entire nation of Israel! It's that fact that makes our lectionary Old Testament lesson for this Sunday one of my two favorite passages in the entire Bible. For me, it's pretty much a toss-up between this passage and one that's found in the New Testament.

Read Genesis 50:15-21 and also read the corresponding Gospel lesson, Matthew 18:21-35 (not, by the way, my other favorite passage) as we seek to see "The Big Picture."






