Last Sunday, we looked at an Old Testament passage from the lectionary that was part of one of the greatest stories in the Bible – the story of Joseph.

This week, the lectionary includes another Old Testament passage that is part of another of the great stories of the Bible.

Following the Israelites deliverance from Egypt and after the crossing of the Red Sea, the people found themselves wandering in the wilderness. It was not an easy journey they were taking and at times it seemed to be more than they could endure. They became downhearted and discouraged and they let Moses and Aaron know of their displeasure.

When we read through the story of the Exodus, it seems as though the people were constantly complaining and whining about their circumstances. Perhaps it seems that way because they really were! Our inclination is to look at – as we referred to it last Sunday – "the big picture" and see God's deliverance from captivity and their eventual arrival in the Promised Land.


The Israelites, however, didn't have the luxury of looking into their future as we do. They could see only their immediate situation and it didn't look at all promising from their perspective.

Dear Eastminster Church Family,



Our Christmas Basket Program is in full swing and school is now in session. Now we are ready to take another step in serving our neighbors at Caze School. Deacons will soon be in touch with Caze Elementary School and we will need to let them know how many families Eastminster will

adopt/sponsor for this Christmas season so they can complete their necessary paperwork in a timely manner and Eastminster can complete its necessary preparations.

The Caze social worker works with us to identify stable and deserving families who do not receive assistance from other charities. We, in turn, work to provide a joyous Christmas for these families. In our Christmas baskets, we not only provide items for the holiday meal, but attempt to provide groceries for each family to be able to prepare healthy meals throughout the winter school break. We also provide gifts for the children in the family who are age 18 and under. It is our suggestion for children to receive a warm outfit and up to three age appropriate toys, books, or games. We refrain from wish lists for specific items so there will be no disappointment if they do not receive a specific request, but the school does provide us with the children's interests. The deacons will provide a Bible for every family that is adopted. We want this program to continue to be an outpouring of our love and cheerful sharing of our blessings, not a burden.

If you are called to this ministry, we want you to consider what size family you would like to sponsor. You can participate in a number of ways: Sunday school classes, small groups, groups of friends or as individuals. Many of these families are non-traditional in the sense that there may be single parent families, special needs children, or maybe multigenerational families. While we do not ask volunteers to buy gifts for any family member over 18, it is important to consider family size when providing grocery and household items.

We have an opportunity to make a difference in the lives of these families by sharing our blessings and the miracle of Christmas love with them.
