#### "Is Your Seed Still in the Barn?"

There is a method of preaching called "proof-texting." It's not a good one. Basically what it means is that you first

come up with a theme and then try to find passages that fit that theme. On the surface, this doesn't sound like such a bad idea. The problem with proof-texting is that it takes the Holy Spirit out of the process of preaching and runs the danger of proclaiming, not the Word of God, but rather the word of the preacher.

There's another side to this, though. Sometimes a passage can take us in a direction that wasn't necessarily intended by the writer but is nevertheless a good direction to go. I think of this sometimes when someone tells me they lost focus while listening to a sermon because something that was said sent them in an entirely different direction. I think that can be a good thing and I urge you not to apologize for it.

All of this leads me to a passage we'll look at this Sunday as we approach Thanksgiving. It's a passage from the prophet Haggai. Now there's a name you don't often see in this column – or anywhere else for that matter!

Haggai is primarily known as the prophet who encouraged the Israelites to re-build the Temple in Jerusalem after they had returned from exile. He offered a voice of both chastisement and encouragement. As he challenges the people to action, he makes a statement that can take us in several different directions.

Unlike last Sunday's very loooong reading, this week's will consist of just two verses. Read Haggai 2:18-19 where the prophet asks, "Is Your Seed Still in the Barn?"


