"Those Who Wait"

A few weeks ago, Trey and I were talking about the Advent season and determined that a good time for him to preach would be December 17, the Sunday of the Children's Christmas Pageant. Since then, as we have continued to talk about preaching, Trey told me he was planning on using one of the lectionary readings for that day. I didn't think much more about it until I started to look at the full scope of the lectionary readings for the season of Advent – the Old Testament, the Gospel and Epistle readings.

When I did, I went into a brief panic, realizing how difficult I always find the Advent readings. I was afraid Trey might be overwhelmed by any of those suggested readings. Fortunately, by the time we get to the third Sunday of Advent, those readings seem to go a different direction, but the first two weeks are always tremendously challenging and problematic.

It might just be me, but I have to confess that the readings in the lectionary for the beginning of Advent give me some difficulty. Perhaps that's the way it's supposed to be. We're getting ready for Christmas...but we're not there yet. There are places we need to go before we can fully embrace of the wonder of the Christmas event.

The Old Testament reading for this Sunday is one of those places we need to go. Read Isaiah 64:1-9 were we find that we are included among "Those Who Wait."
