Second Sunday in Lent "When Losing Is Winning"



We've been focusing on the lectionary passages that are found in Mark's gospel for the past several weeks. We've talked about how different Mark is from the other two synoptic gospels (Matthew and Luke). We've considered Mark's

frequent use of the word "immediately" as he moves us quickly from one event to another.

This week, we'll move ahead in Mark to the eighth chapter and consider a teaching of Jesus that gets right at the heart of the gospel. It's a teaching that was very difficult for the disciples to hear - one that even caused Peter to take Jesus aside to reprimand him. Jesus promptly rebuked Peter for his lack of understanding and quickly put him in his place.

We tend to judge Peter harshly for his criticism of Jesus, but we're really no different. We think our commitment in faith should be something that will bring us a life of ease and a level of admiration from others. Jesus suggests that the truth is guite the opposite. We read his words and we think we can understand and accept them and yet, in reality, we're every bit as oblivious as the disciples were.

The standards of the world continue to beckon us and tempt us. We look favorably upon the so-called "winners" in this world and we look pitifully on the losers. We ourselves want to be winners and not losers. In the midst of the current Winter Olympic games, one can see how the world views even those who "only" win a silver or bronze medal – they

Jesus suggests something different – a view of the world that is completely the opposite of what has become acceptable. Read Mark 8:31-38 to discover "When Losing Is Winning."
