

"The Cave"

We're in the second week of the third section of our Summer Sermon Series dedicated to "Secular Movies, Books & Songs PASTOR with a Spiritual Message." The basic premise is that we can find a profound

message in unexpected places. Philip Yancey has written an entire book based on that premise – Finding God in Unexpected Places.

In this series, I'm afraid I've had a tendency to use movies, books and songs that are – for lack of a better word – old. I can try to justify that by saying they are works that have stood the test of time. Nevertheless, perhaps it would be good to take a look at something a bit more contemporary to help us understand that we can find a spiritual component in the things we see, hear and read every

This week I'd like us to focus on a song that may have a multitude of interpretations. There are seemingly obvious references to the philosophical writings of Plato, Homer's Odyssey, the life of St. Francis and even the Letter of James in the New Testament! That may seem to be quite a stretch, but when you hear the lyrics of the song, you'll understand what I mean.

It comes from a group called Mumford & Sons. Many – if not most – of you are probably unfamiliar with this band. They're a contemporary British group whose sound might be categorized as folk-rock.

Often, when experiencing something from the world of the Arts, there are various ways that one can be touched. I think that applies with the song we'll consider this week. The way I've chosen to understand it is most certainly not what was intended by the writer but I think that's the beauty that can be found in the world of the Arts.

Read Acts 9:1-20 as we consider what it might mean to emerge from "The Cave."

Per Capita is "the tie that binds" - annual giving that unites the entire church in the ongoing and essential work that guides the Office of the General Assembly, the life of the Presbyterian Church (USA) and benefits every congregation PC(USA) and every mid council ministry. Per capita is



the primary source of funding for the Office of the General Assembly, and is how Presbyterians mutually and equitably share the costs of coming together to discern the Spirit's leading for the future.

- It is how Presbyterians are trained to become better ruling elders, deacons, and ministers of the word and sacrament/ teaching elders.
- It is how Presbyterians come together to discern God's call in their lives.
- It is how Presbyterians participate in the life of the wider church by serving on General Assembly committees and commissions, regardless of distance or financial re-
- It is how Presbyterians participate in the life of the church universal as we commit ourselves to work and live in fellowship with "all persons in every nation" (Book of Order, G-4.0101)

Per Capita for 2018 is \$36 per member. If you have not paid your Per Capita we encourage you to do so.


