Heads, Hearts & Hands for Christ in Service & Celebration



Last Sunday we looked at a passage in James and suggested the possibility that James is really not a letter but rather a sermon. The tone of the writing certainly PASTOR seems to indicate as much.

This week's lectionary epistle reading is again from James and it immediately follows last week's passage. In the third chapter of James, the brother of Jesus (if that is, in fact, who its author is) warns us of the danger of using language that may have a tendency to harm others. We don't often think about how important our words are, and yet they can have a profound impact on another person – positively or negatively.

I have a suggestion to offer - something to think about this week in preparation for a consideration of what James tells us about the importance of the words we use. Try to think back over your life to things people have said to you that you clearly remember. I would imagine those things left you with either very positive or very negative feelings about yourself and about the other person as well.

Now, take that exercise a slightly different direction -adirection that may be a bit uncomfortable. Think of someone else asking that same question of themselves and remembering something you said to them. Was that person left with positive or negative feelings about what they remember you saying to them?

I don't know about you, but it frightens me to honestly think about what memories I may have created in another person by something I've said to them.

Read James 3:1-12 where we find the brother of Jesus addressing this very issue and talking to us about "Verbal Sticks & Stones."





Service Challenge Youth Vs. Everyone Else!

Last Sunday in worship, we focused on the passage in James that very clearly addresses the necessity of serving others if we are truly following Jesus Christ. He says, "What does it profit if someone has faith but has not works? Faith – by itself, if it has no works – is dead!"

As I was sharing those words in worship, I couldn't help but look over at the youth section of the sanctuary and realize that every one of our young people has a very clear understanding of what James is talking about because every one of our youth spends a great deal of time and energy in serving others.

I wonder if that's true for the rest of us? I think we have a reversal of roles in our Eastminster family. I think it's our youth who serve as the role models for the adults in what it means to give sacrificially in service to those in need.

This idea didn't come from me, but I think it's a good one. Let's devise a way to calculate how much time we spend as a congregation in service to others and see if our youth group members (about 5% of the entire church family) spend more time than all the rest of us combined in such service. Give me your ideas and suggestions and we'll offer a more detailed plan next week.
