

"Whatever"

Every parent cringes at that word, don't we? It's not the word itself – it's the manner in which it's said. You remind your teen-age daughter that she has to be home by 11:00

and she rolls her eyes and offers a curt "Whatever." You tell your son to mow the lawn and he dismissively waves his hand while walking away and says, "Whatever."

Believe it or not, that word is found in the Bible. No, it's not used in the way parents are accustomed to hearing it, but it's there nonetheless. In fact, it's found in the passage that is our lectionary gospel reading this Sunday.

It's in the gospel of John that we're informed of the first miracle Jesus performed. It's at the beginning of his ministry and the miracle itself is fascinating but of equal interest is the way in which John uses that miracle to help us understand a great deal of what will follow it in his gospel.

Read John 2:1-11 where the mother of Jesus says "Whatever."
