"<u>All Together Now</u>"

**PASTOR** No, I haven't decided to return to our "... **PASTOR** Songs That Speak to the Soul" series, although I have obviously used a song

title for the sermon title this week. I can't help but read our lectionary epistle reading and think of The Beatles song of the above title.

There are passages of scripture that speak to us in a clearly spiritual fashion and there are also passages that speak to us in common sense as well as spiritual fashion. When Paul was writing to the Christians in the city of Corinth, he offered guidance to them that fits very clearly into that second category. He saw a lot of problems within the life of the church and he was trying to offer some suggestions that would help move the people beyond those problems. What he came up with is absolutely brilliant.

Paul gives a very clear picture and offers a practical analogy that should be understandable to anyone in virtually any group of people. It just so happens that it works better within the life of the church than anywhere else. Paul's comparison of the church to our physical body offers an "Aha" moment for all of us. We read his words and we can all say, "Oh! I get it! That's how the church should function!"

While the meaning of his words can be applied to any group of people working together to accomplish something (an athletic team, a workplace group, a neighborhood, a family) it is most clearly applicable to the church. I have always loved the message of his words to the Corinthians about this matter.

Read I Corinthians 12:12-31 where Paul challenges us to be "All Together Now."

The coordinator then follows up and reports updates as are communicated only from the requestor to the prayer chain list. This is to keep prayer requests current. If you name the person for whom the prayer is requested, you must have that person's permission. (For example: Request from Julie Smith: Please pray for John Doe as he is having surgery on Thursday. Julie must have John's permission to submit a request). If the person being prayed for would like to receive cards, please include their mailing address.

This is a wonderful way to share our concern and compassion for those in need. Praver is what sustains us in life. It is a lifeline to the one who gives us life. Through the Spirit, prayer gives ability and strength; we don't have on our own. It gives us strong and courageous hearts.
