“If...”

For the next three Sundays, our lectionary epistle readings are found in the same chapter. That is a rarity. Of course, it wouldn't be if we were talking about the gospel readings because that occurs on a regular basis – three or more Sundays being needed to exhaust a full chapter of one of the gospels.

With the epistles, though, that's rather rare. It seems as though we usually don't spend more than a single week on a particular chapter of Paul's writings. The reason we need three weeks for one chapter in this situation, though, is two-fold. For one thing, the chapter under consideration happens to be the longest chapter in all of Paul's writings. For another, it is so vitally important and so jam-packed with significance that its full meaning can never be fully exhausted.

That being said, we'll just spend one week on it and try to capture the heart of the message of the entire chapter in one sermon. The significance of the chapter lies in the fact that it is the earliest written account of the most basic aspect of our faith – the resurrection of Jesus. Most of what we know and believe about the resurrection finds its basis in the fifteenth chapter of Paul's first letter to the church in the city of Corinth.

Read all of I Corinthians 15 and we'll focus on some of its verses that contain the heart of what we believe about the resurrection of Jesus as Paul offers a powerful statement that begins with “If...”

"How Can I Join Eastminster?"



As many of you know, there are three ways of joining a Presbyterian church – by profession of faith, by reaffirmation of faith or by letter of transfer.

For a number of years, we have followed the practice of either offering a Member Exploration Seminar prior to someone joining the church or doing it in reverse order – have them join and then at a later time have the opportunity to attend a Member Seminar.

We provide the opportunity to join the church on any given Sunday following worship. This makes the procedure very simple and allows for the movement of the Holy Spirit to call someone to make that decision at any given moment. We use the story of Philip and the Ethiopian as our guide as he said to Philip – "What is to prevent me...."

If someone wishes to join the church on a Sunday, it's a simple matter of telling the pastor or an elder following worship and we immediately have a session meeting for that express purpose. A quorum for receiving new members is two elders and the moderator and all that is required is a declaration of faith in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior and a commitment to be active in the life and ministry of the congregation.

If you or someone you know is interested in joining Eastminster, that's how simple it is! After the 24th of February, the procedure will change by necessity since our session moderator will not be present in worship each Sunday and so it will require a more scheduled time.


