Quilters Since we are not a part of the annual report, we thought you would like to know what is happening with the quilters. We have continued to meet every Tuesday morning and to be productive while enjoying good fellowship. We are machine quilters, not hand quilters, and make throw-sized quilts only. We feel that instead of "heirlooms", our quilts are to be used regularly as a token of the warmth of Christ's love. On occasion we have made other items such as walker bags and catheter covers to donate and we are always open to those projects. In 2018 we welcomed 3 new babies with quilts, celebrated one congregation member who reached age 90; and reached out to 4 members who were ill or had surgery. In addition, we donated 9 guilts; one to Cedar Hall school for a fundraiser and the remaining 8 to the Christian Life Center's "Parenting Rewards" program. An unhappy circumstance for the quilters now is that one of our most faithful and productive members is ill and may not be able to participate any longer. So new hands are needed! We continue to work and do have a reserve of quilts to draw from so for the near future will be able to reach out to those in the congregation as occasions present themselves. Another cause for concern is that our long-arm quilting machine (which allows us to finish our quilts easier than with our regular sewing machines) is old and becoming difficult to regulate. We do have it serviced and hope it will continue to work for us since a new - or even a newer used - one would be prohibitively expensive. The quilting room is open Tuesday mornings from 9:00 and to Noon (although we can be flexible) and we welcome new members at any level of sewing skill. We thank the Community and World Missions committee for the financial support that allows us to maintain our equipment

and purchase materials needed for our projects.
