Update on our Transitional Pastor Search

In January, the Eastminster Transitional Pastor Search Committee, elected by session, began the search process for a Transitional Pastor (formerly known as Interim Pastor). The search involves a coordination of efforts between the Transitional Pastor Search Committee, your session, and the Presbytery of Ohio Valley.

A significant milestone was reached this past week with the completion of the Ministry Information Form (MIF) document. The content of the MIF will enable pastors who may be interested in our transitional pastor position to learn more about our congregation and our hopes for pastoral leadership. Last Wednesday, the session approved the MIF, and it was subsequently sent to Presbytery for final approval.

After Presbytery approval, the MIF will be posted on the Christian Leadership Connection (CLC) matching and referral system of the Presbyterian Church (USA). The Christian Leadership Connection tool will help us to gather names of qualified candidates for further evaluation.

While the Transitional Pastor search moves forward, the session (with the Worship & Music Committee and our church staff) have taken other temporary steps to keep things running smoothly. This includes arranging for guest preachers for Sunday Worship. Important note: None of the guest preachers filling the pulpit temporarily are candidates for our Transitional Pastor position, and they are not "auditioning" for the position.
