Update from the Transitional Pastor Search Committee:

The Ministry Information Form (MIF), which is basically a profile for Eastminster, was completed and posted in the Presbyterian Church (USA) website system in March. Your Committee spent several weeks summarizing our church's ministry, descriptions of our congregation, and what characteristics we are seeking in a Transitional Pastor candidate.

The Presbytery matches candidates to our needs and, in addition, candidates can refer themselves after reading our MIF on the website. In total, we have received over 30 Personal Information Forms (PIFs) from these candidates. (The PIF is the candidate's profile.)

Your Committee has read, reviewed, and discussed these candidates in detail, and our objective is to identify the top candidates with the best qualities and competencies for serving as our Transitional Pastor.

Many factors have been considered for each potential candidate, such as:

- Their education and training
- Experience serving congregations of similar size as Eastminster
- Experience serving as Transitional Pastors
- How they plan worship services
- How they work with church staff members
- Review sample sermon tapes and videos, when available
- Timing of their availability, when their current assignment ends
- And many others

During May, your Committee began the process of teleconference interviews with the top candidates to explore the above factors in detail.

During June, we will conduct additional interviews and be contacting candidates' references.

We are making steady progress in our search journey, and we are committed, with God's guidance, to finding the right person for Eastminster. We want to identify a transitional pastor for Eastminster who will not just keep us in a "holding pattern", but instead will lead and support our church in growing, changing, and moving forward in the direction God is calling for us. The candidates that we are focusing on are well experienced as Transitional Pastors.

Please continue to pray for God's guidance and blessing upon our search process and for the members of your Committee (Barb Ferguson, Tim Fiedler, Patti Garcia, Karla Horrell, Shannon Irmscher, Melissa Mattingly, and John Niehaus).

THERMOSTATS

The thermostats located throughout the church facilities have been programmed to "set back" during significant portions of every day to conserve on energy costs. While these pro-



grams have tried to anticipate normal usage patterns for specific areas; for example, the Sanctuary on Sunday mornings and Tuesday evenings, the choir room on Thursday evenings, etc., we recognize there will be other times of usage that have not been anticipated. Or you may just feel it is too cool or too warm for your needs.

We want you to be comfortable, but is important the PROGRAMING not be changed. If you are there at a non-programmed time and need to adjust the temperature, simply go to the thermostat controlling the area you are occupying. Tap the screen to lighten, and at the lower right side is the temperature at which that system is set, accompanied by an up arrow and a down arrow. Tap the up or down arrow to raise or lower the temperature to the setting you would like, and then simply walk away. Do not press any other buttons; no "Holds", no "programs", nothing else. We have large volumes of air at the church, so allow the system several minutes to reach the temperature you would like, just like at home.

Why is this important? On Tuesday May21st we were meeting with contractors in the Sanctuary utility room examining possible upgrades, and the large air handler for the Sanctuary was running the entire time. Following the meeting, we went up to the Sanctuary, and found the system on a permanent hold set at 70 degrees. Who knows how many days or weeks the unoccupied Sanctuary had been maintaining 70 degrees, 24 hours a day!

If you remember, please return the temperature to the setting you first found, but if you forget, the program will reset the temperature automatically at the next interval. Be comfortable, enjoy our facilities, but please only touch the up and down arrow at the lower right side temperature reading.
