## THERMOSTAT SETTINGS

The thermostats located throughout the church facilities have been programmed to "set back" during signifi-



cant portions of everyday to conserve energy costs. While these programs have tried to anticipate normal usage patterns for specific areas; for example, the Sanctuary on Sunday mornings and Tuesday evenings, the choir room on Thursday evenings, etc., we recognize that there will be other times of usage that have not been anticipated. Or you may just feel it is too cool or too warm for your needs.

We want you to be comfortable, but is important the PROGRAMING not be changed. If you are there at a nonprogrammed time and need to adjust the temperature, simply go to the thermostat controlling the area you are occupying. Tap the screen to lighten, and at that lower right side is th up or down arrow to raise or lower the temperature to the setting you would like, and then simply walk away. Do not press any other buttons; no "Holds', no "programs", nothing else. We have large volumes of air at the church, so allow the system several minutes to reach the temperature you would like, just like at home.

If you remember, please return the temperature to the setting you first found, but if you forget, the program will reset the temperature automatically at the next interval. Be comfortable, enjoy our facilities, but please only touch the up and down arrow at the lower right side temperature reading. Thank you!





#### MEN'S CLUB SATURDAY BREAKFAST COVID-19 PROCEDURES Updated: February 20, 2021

The Men's Club meets the first Saturday of each month (SATURDAY, MARCH 6, 2021) for a pancake breakfast and a short video on a Biblical topic. Since the outbreak of the Pandemic, the Men's Club has postponed its meetings (except for November). Many of our members are in the age category to get the vaccine. It is hoped that many will have had at least their first shot as we prepare to begin anew in March. As the fellowship of the church begins its journey to a more normal status, re-initiation of the Men's Club can begin with restrictions cognizant of the present risk involved with the pandemic. The following procedures are an initial attempt at renewing that fellowship, recognizing that changes will occur as needed:

- 1. Masks will be worn at all times with the exception when consuming food or drink.
- An email announcement of the breakfast will be made. The group size will now be limited to 20. This number may be changed as conditions warrant. Reservations will be required and can be made by responding to the email.
- 3. Those who might not feel well the day of the breakfast are encouraged to stay home.
- 4. Four tables (long) with five chairs each will be set up in Fellowship Hall.
- 5. You are encouraged to wash your hands with soap and water or hand sanitizer.
- 6. Coffee will be poured in cups and can be picked up and members will return to the table they will be seated at until the morning prayer is spoken.
- 7. When it is time to serve the meal, the cooks will prepare plates with pancakes and bacon or sausage.
- 8. Each table will be excused individually to come to the serving line for the food. Social distancing will be maintained by those in line.
- 9. Cooks will pour the syrup on the pancakes in accordance with consumer's wishes.
- 10. Coffee will be refilled with one server bringing around the pot to the tables
- 11. Upon finishing the meal, masks will be adorned.
- 12. Room 101 where the video is to be shown, will be set up with chairs allowing for 6 feet of separation.
