

Sunday February 14 will offer a little different focus for us. The Session has proclaimed that day as a Racial Justice Sabbath. We will be joining with dozens of other area churches offering similar experiences in their own sanctuaries.

What does this mean? It will give us an opportunity to reaffirm that all people are deeply loved by God, regardless of who they are. While this is something we may believe, we don't often intentionally say so in worship. It is important to reclaim our belief that anyone would be welcome to join us for worship, mission, fellowship, or anything that the church does.

This Racial Justice Sabbath movement has largely been promoted by a local grassroots movement called BRIDGE, (Building Respect & Integrity in Diverse Greater Evansville). As a group they are inviting "every faith community to emphasize their faith's teaching on racial equity this weekend in order to motivate and inspire their members to make our region a place where all ethnicities and cultures feel a sense of belonging."
