This past Sunday Alanna sang "*This Joyful Eastertide*." It is a true celebration of what Jesus did, that also reminds us that Easter is a season, not only a single day observance. In the church calendar we will have celebrated 7 Sundays of Easter by the time we reach Pentecost. Furthermore, Each Sunday has historically and traditionally been considered a sort of "little Easter." This means each Sunday

we remember the resurrection of Christ, and the promise of what Jesus' resurrection means for us. Even during the season of Lent when we try to focus more on penitence and going without, when we consider the humanity and suffering of Christ, the Sundays "don't count." Lent is defined as the 40 days between Ash Wednesday and Easter *not including Sundays*. Many people who observe the spiritual discipline of giving something up for Lent allow themselves to enjoy that thing they have given up on Sunday, to celebrate the Resurrection.

As we continue to go through Eastertide, or the season of Easter, I hope you take some moments to consider the joy of the season, the celebratory nature of resurrection. We often focus on the struggle, the difficulties of life, the hardships. It is easy to be consumed with these types of thoughts. Here are some points I invite you to ponder:

-Where do I find feelings of joy and celebration? Do I recognize these as gifts of God's grace?

-What are real ways we can celebrate the resurrection? -What does new life (resurrection) mean in the face of daily struggles and challenges?

-When I feel I have received bad news, where can I look for the promise of resurrection?

When I was much younger, I noticed a change in one of my family member's prayers in the midst of an Easter season. He would conclude each prayer with a version of the phrase "we pray in the name of our risen Lord..." As a person listening to those prayers at meal times, travel times, and other prayer occasions it served as a life-giving reminder.

I hope you find ways to enjoy the gift of God's power of life over death.
