The word has popped up more in recent Bible readings of mine, particularly in worship preparation. On patrol, he came across a soccer ball, and tossed it back over the perimeter fence. Later, another ball came flying across the fence. The soldier was told not to worry about it, someone would retrieve all the lost balls later. He decided to toss the second ball over anyway. He spent the better part of Mother's Day afternoon in the 90+ degree desert heat, tossing lost balls to kids he couldn't even see. So, those children would know that somone....unseen....on the other side, cared. On social media his mother shared this story and asked: "What did you do to bring Joy to someone's life today? (FYI....this boy's mother....couldn't have gotten any better Mother's Day gift better than hearing this story of her son's kind heart)"

I wish you all joy, and hope you find ways to share joy with others. -- JT
