Our Interim Pastor

The first Sunday in June marked a milestone for Eastminster, the first time we celebrated the Lord's Supper in over a year - outside of the monthly zoom communion services. After sharing the Lords Supper with you, certain memories began to return to me.

Some of you know that the Presbyterian Church, (USA) has a constitution made up of a Book of Confessions, and a Book of Order. The Book of Order is divided up into four parts:

Foundations of Presbyterian Polity, Form of Government, Director for Worship, and Rules of Discipline. As Yoda said of the sacred Jedi texts, "page turners, they are not." As documents describing how to be a church and defining organizational structure, they tend to stick to the basics and are not written for aesthetics. However, at times, parts of the Book of order can be downright inspiring. A pastor I once worked with incorporated a bit into the invitation to the Lord's Table. He would generally say,

"This sacrament is not just for Presbyterians, but for all those who come in faith, repentance, and love; including baptized children who are being instructed in the nature of the sacrament."

At the time, those words were from the Book of Order. The wording and descriptions have changed a bit over the years, but it was a nice moment in worship to hear something from an organizing document to invite worshipers to the table. It was the ministry of welcome. When we invite people to the Lord's Table, we must remember it is not our table, and strive to be as welcoming to others as Jesus was.

Questions for reflection:

- -What would worship look like if we were always that inviting?
- -Are there ways we can improve our welcome to others who might seek what Christ offers?
- -What thoughts and memories come to you, when you share the Lord's Supper?
