Camp Stewards

In 1940 the Little Grassy Creek in Southern Illinois was dammed and the result was the formation of what

is now known as Little Grassy Lake. This project was one designed to provide work and relieve those suffering from the economic depression. While other similar lakes were created at the same time, this one was different. The land around Little Grassy Lake was to be set aside to establish organized camps for youth.

Organizations that were allowed to establish these camps included the Presbyterian Church, Methodist Church, Seventh Dad Adventists, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, Future Farmers of America, and Southern Illinois University. Each of these organizations was allowed to lease their particular parcel of land from the federal government at the grand sum of \$1 per year. Because processing, paperwork, and administration of collecting this "rent" would have cost much more than the income the government received, it is never actually collected.

I share this story for two reasons: First, sometimes the government does good things that make good sense and this is one of those stories. Second, this is an interesting way to look at stewardship. Property is owned by one party, leased for free by another party, and available for children, youth, and adults to recreate, learn, and grow in the out of doors.

Here are some questions: How could the church use what we have (buildings, grounds, bus) in a similar way? How can you re-imagine what stewardship means for you? Where do we have opportunities to offer value or use to others?
