Acts 14:23: And after they had appointed elders for them in each church, with prayer and fasting they entrusted them to the Lord in whom they had come to believe.

The Book of Acts could generally be described as the story of Christ's disciples making more disciples, and the establishment of new churches. A major component of this

story is the presence of prayer in that ministry. This scripture follows the establishment of churches in certain cities and describes the establishment of leaders.

I do not know much about your personal spiritual lives, whether prayer and Scripture reading are part of your regular spiritual discipline. I hope you attempt to spend time doing both. The above scripture has often challenged me. I have even specifically been asked how much of my prayer life involves asking God to help me develop as a leader? Congregational leaders, do you make prayers like this? Do you ask God to help you grow in faith, whether you are a leader or not? Challenging questions.

Decades ago, Bishop Lesslie Newbigin of the Church of South India explored another challenging question: "Can the West be converted?" An Indonesian believer initially asked him this question. This caught many off guard then, and perhaps even catches some of us off guard today. We think of ourselves as the ones who have been converted and have a difficult time viewing our own neighbors and our own communities as the mission field. But, when we ask one another questions like "Why don't more people come to church?" therein lies the answer. There is a sense in which conversion needs to take place here in our post-Christian community, our post-Christian nation. Within this, prayer is an essential part of our responsibility in trying to bring about such a conversion.

I hope that you spend time praying for what it is you truly need and not what you desire.

We talk so frequently about hoping for the best for the future of this congregation, for the future of the ministry of Eastminster Church. My request for you is that, if you're not already doing so, please pray for God's guidance of this church. Pray for the leadership of the Holy Spirit; pray for discernment as we hope to follow God's leading. As we retell stories of Christ's affirmation of life over death, pray for new life, pray for new life to come to this our beloved church.
