As a pastor, I feel it is important to find times to be optimistic, hopeful, encouraging, and specifically attempt to build up rather than break down the congregation. However, there are times I have to call out concerns, issues, or problems that are evident.

I have been informed by the Mission/Outreach committee that the scheduled Halloween Carnival will be cancelled. The reason: lack of participation. There were some committee members and some others who offered to take part in putting the program together. However, there were not enough people willing to share enough of the work to make the event happen. The committee feels that it is better at this point to cancel then to put on a lackluster program for the children of the community.

I have to be honest, that if the problem were an animal, it would look more like an octopus having many appendages, than a snake. Here are some questions I invite you to consider as possible tentacles:

- How often must planned programs and activities be cancelled before more people in the congregation realize the need to 'step up?'
- When will we realize that if we hope "someone" will volunteer, that someone is ourself?
- Generally we use personal contact, the Messenger, oral announcements, the website, and facebook to communicate; if you didn't know your help was requested, how can people effectively reach you?
- While we are still struggling within a pandemic, what are other reasons you say "no" to your church when your church asks for your help?
- Do you really want the church to succeed? If so, what are you willing to do to help make that happen?
- Is there a silver lining? Are we learning from recent program cancellations? What can we do to improve going forward?

This last bullet point may be the most crucial. As a church we can die, we can survive, or we can even dare to thrive. But it will take finding something we can become passionate about and participate with. Of course that something is our faith in God, but how do we partner with what God is doing in our community? How do we effectively reach out and provide ministry that is needed? What is it that you could passionately say "yes" to?

Another pandemic that has been taking place for decades is the declining church. Traditional denominational churches are continuing to dwindle, and even close all over the world. What we have been doing in the past is no longer bringing people to our church family. Waiting for people to simply show up is not working. Do you want to treat yourselves for what ails you, or sign up for a church hospice program? The choice is truly yours.

God, please guide us and unite us in ministry. Amen.

PNC "Brief"


