


In a recent conversation with a friend, I was challenged. My friend was pondering the organization of the church and was frustrated with the degree of disagreement and dysfunction. His existential question was, "Is this what Jesus had in mind when he called us to be the body?"

A flood of responses came to my mind. First, because this is what we have, it must be what was in Jesus' mind. Second, we are all imperfect and affected by shortcomings, so how we relate is often flawed and produces flawed results. Also, I thought about how much more work "we" the faithful have to do as we seek to live lives obedient to Christ.

These, and other thoughts I had, contained elements of truth but also missed the mark. I do think one frequent temptation is complacency, so we must keep at our obedience. Also, despite our susceptibility to sin, humans are wonderful creatures of God – made in God's image. Therefore, perhaps some of the dysfunction is by design and will be an incubator for great things to emerge.

One challenge we are all faced with is truly loving one another. A therapist once asked me if I felt like I was loved "warts and all." That, he said, was the definition of unconditional love. Statements that begin with "I love you but...." place a condition on love. Whether talking about our local church, the machinations of the Presbytery, or even our General Assembly, we have to practice loving one another. Only then can we accept one another's imperfections and realize that we are all working toward the goal of God's Peaceable Kingdom. Perhaps we will learn more of ourselves and others in the process of actively loving one another and be able to see that the "imperfect" results are actually okay.



When did America first call for a national Thanksgiving?

America first called for a national day of thanksgiving to celebrate victory over the British in the Battle of Saratoga. 1789, George Washington again called for a national day of thanks on the last Thursday of November to commemorate the the Revolutionary War and the ratification of the Constitution. And during the Civil War, both the Confederacy and the Union issued Thanksgiving Day proclamations following maior victories.

The first official proclamation of a national Thanksgiving holiday didn't come until 1863, when President Abraham Lincoln called for an annual Thanksgiving celebration on the final Thursday in November. The proclamation was the result of years of impassioned lobbying by "Mary Had a Little Lamb" author and abolitionist Sarah Josepha Hale.
