This coming Sunday we will dedicate a new painting that Melba Hutchinson has donated for Nativity Hall. The Reproduction of "Mary and Elizabeth" by Carl Heinrich Bloch was in the sanctuary this past Sunday, and will then hang in Nativity Hall Just to the right of

the exit to the parking lot.

The Scripture reading that will be our focus on Sunday is Luke 1: 39-45. We will look at the greater context of Elizabeth's pregnancy, and Mary's, and the connection between the two women, and the children they bore. An interesting feature of the story is when Mary visits Elizabeth, Elizabeth says the child 'leapt' in her womb as Mary approachd. The way they speak to one another also clearly shows the love the women have for one another, and for God.

Carl Heinrich Bloch was born in Copenhagen on May 23, 1834, he died in 1890. He spent several years living in Italy, studying other artists and their works, and developed his style during that time. He was "commissioned to produce 23 paintings for the Chapel at Frederiksborg Palace. These were all scenes from the life of Christ which have become very popular as illustrations. The originals, painted between 1865 and 1879, are still at Frederiksborg Palace." - CarlBloch.org We hope you can join us virtually or in person as we dedicate this beautiful reproduction, and celebrate the story that inspired it.
