EASTMINSTER QUILTERS

As we are not a committee of the Church, the Eastminster Quilters' annual report was not included in the official EPC document; however, we want to keep you up with our activities. We continue to meet

every Tuesday morning and to be productive while enjoying good fellowship. We are machine quilters not hand quilters, and make throw-sized or crib-sized quilts only. We feel that instead of "heirlooms" our quilts are to be used regularly as a token of the warmth of Christ's love.

Our newer members continue to make good progress, and indeed, we all learn each time we try a new pattern or technique. We presented ten quilts this year. One for a newborn (friend of the congregation); one to a young girl to celebrate her baptism; four to individuals due to illness or surgery; and two to Cedar Hall School to help with their annual fundraiser. The final two quilts went back to our former quilting member who made them – the only two of hers remaining -- since she is unable to quilt any longer.

We did again take a short break from quilting: one member made a casserole carrier and an apron (special occasion) and others made Mug Rugs – small squares to set your coffee mug on which are made with the same steps as a quilt. We donated several of those to EPW for table game prizes. We did also present the September EPW program and many members brought their own quilts for a fun "Show and Tell".

Early in the year we were given the use of an older long arm machine but have had difficulty setting it up in the space available, so it is not usable for us at this time.

The Quilting room is open Tuesday mornings from 9:00 am to Noon and we welcome new members at any level of sewing skill. We thank the Community and World Missions Committee for the financial support that allows us to maintain our equipment and purchase the materials needed for our projects. You can also help by letting one of the quilters (or the office) know of congregation members or friends of the church we may not be aware of who are in circumstances where a quilt would be appropriate.
