Exploring Eastminster

Have you enjoyed seeing the wall hangings in the Sanctuary? The two – one hung on Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday, and the other hanging now until Pentecost – were machine quilted by one of the founders of the Eastminster Quilters, Susan Clayton, and have been kept in the quilting room. The current quilters had never thought to display them in this way until a chance comment was made one day by a visitor.

The banner hanging now has a wonderful inscription on the back. It is as follows:



"In 2004 the congregation of EPC launched a project. The sewing group committed to make 25 bed quilts for the new Monte Blanco Retreat Center in Bolivia. Many people from the congregation and community were involved in dyeing the fabrics, designing, sewing, and finishing the quilts.

This quilt, entitled "Joyous Connections" was made with scraps of the fabric from the project ... as a reminder of the celebration and joy in the shared ministry. "

The quilters' annual report from that year explains that the group began as a "Learn to Quilt" day organized by the Small Groups Committee in the Spring of 2004. While constructing a sample block, "We formed a bond and decided to continue as a service group. Our mission is to cheer, console, and congratulate with the art and warmth of a homemade quilt."

The quilting room, located across the hall from the Parlor, was at that point used only as a meeting room, although it had originally served as office space and then as a Sunday School room. The group was given permission by the Session to set it up as their own space, and Community and World Missions Committee, which then sponsored the mission trip to Bolivia in 2005 during which 25 quilts were presented, provided start-up money for needed supplies. And that committee has continued since to include the group in their annual budget.



The sewing room today is equipped with four sewing machines, a serger, and a long arm (finishing) quilter, all of varying age. An additional machine has been donated and is set up in an area of the basement while we are working to make it usable for our purposes. We have a wall of fabric organized in containers by color, thread to match any color combination, patterns ranging from beginner level to skilled, all needed supplies, and large work spaces.

In addition to that large project for Bolivia, the group several years after that made and presented 20 quilts at one time to new Habitat for Humanity home owners when a community of homes was completed on the city's SE side.

The group today is much smaller, with none of the original members remaining, but still has a goal of making a donation of lap quilts each year to a nursing home or other charitable organization in addition to those given to congregation members. And since the response to the banners displayed has been so positive, members are on the look-out for other religious-themed patterns to make and dis-

play for other Church celebrations. You are always welcome to join the group on Tuesday mornings from 9:00 to 12:00. No experience is necessary!
