ROOF UPDATE

You may have noticed the blue tarps on the roof.

In late 2021, the roof was damaged due to a significant storm. We have tried to work with the insurance company to address the damage. Their advice was to repair the damage in smaller spots, but this did not prove adequate. The tarps are helping to



protect the roof and the church building from further water damage.

The church's insurer has not honored our request to replace the slate roof. After much prayerful consideration, session and the trustees made the decision to pursue legal representation versus the insurer. If legal proceedings are necessary, we will be left with no choice but to go forward.

We appreciate your prayers for good outcomes and we look forward to when the roof is able to be replaced.
