thankful Alanna Keenan brought forward the Christianity and the Arts opportunity of Brookellle joining for a concert and worship, and for all her leadership with the weekend.



# **Congratulations North Green Brigade!**

The North Green Brigade marching band from North High School made school, EVSC, and ISSMA History this past weekend when they attended the 2023 Bands of America Chattanooga TN Regional Championship. Throughout the day they competed with 18 other bands from Kentucky, Tennessee, Georgia, Alabama and South Carolina in preliminary competition to make the finals where they started fresh to compete against 11 other bands for the Championship title. In preliminary competition the NGB received awards for Best Visual Performance and placed 2nd in Class 2A. For the first time in school history the NGB advanced to finals competition where they received awards for Best Visual Performance, Outstanding General Effect and 1st Place in overall competition, being named the Chattanooga Regional Champion. This makes them the first school in the EVSC to claim the title, the first ISSMA Class B band in Indiana to claim the title, and only the 14th band in Indiana to win a Bands of America Regional Championship.

The youth members involved with the NGB include Jacob Irmscher, Chloe Webb, and Sydney Webb. Jacob is a freshman and first year member; he plays saxophone and is also a sideline conductor. Chloe is a senior and a six year member; she plays flute. Sydney is a Freshman and a two year member; she plays the clarinet. All three members have worked hard to perfect their performance with approximately 300 of practice so far. They are about halfway through their season which ends on October 28 at ISSMA State Finals at Lucas Oil Stadium.

Our congregation has another more chance to see them perform locally by going to ISSMA Regional Competition held at Central High School on October 7.
