Drawing from his faith and from games that that he played as child, James Naismith created a team sport that he believed could transform the heart, the mind, and character of people. With good coaching, he believed that basketball could produce, "initiative, agility, accuracy, alertness, co-operation, skill, reflex judgment, speed, self-confidence, self-sacrifice, self-control, and sportsmanship." He went so far to say, "there is no place in basketball for the egotist."

Chaplain in the National Guard and volunteer chaplain in WWI, bringing his service as a physician and minister to the front lines in France, Naismith like so many Presbyterians and other Christians we know kept finding new ways of learning and serving.

In Lent, you and I are invited closer to the One whose life and extraordinary love *forever* transforms the world giving strength and inspiration in the midst of so many challenges.

May we follow Jesus closely, as learners and servants by His grace growing in beautiful collaboration to bless the world God so loves!

I love spending time with my sons, Scott and Jake, as well as my 4-year-old grandson, Eli.


I worked at the Dunigan Family YMCA Membership Department for over 20 years.



Maundy Thursday - Good Friday Prayer Vigil


