Starfish has been able to provide food, rent, utility help, clothing, and other items for 30 individuals/families this year.

The good news is our little pantry is becoming well known just through word of mouth. The not-so-good-news is that, unfortunately, conditions in the community are not getting any better. Twenty-five of those 30 people/families have been added since January. At times, we have been providing food to 3-4 individuals or families per day.
